Food Assistance is available

Village Hope Church in Parma provides fresh



food boxes to anyone in need on the second Thursday of the month from 11 a.m.—1 p.m. Boxes include produce, dairy items, meat, and non-perishable food. Bread and

baked items are often included.

Payment plan

The Village offers utility payment plans. Contact the Village office if you are interested in being put on the plan.

The plans are set up with monthly payments of the same amount made the 15th of each month.

If you are on the plan already please know that each regular billing you will need to let the office know if you want to continue on the plan. **We do not automatically put you on the plan if you were on it before.**

Ordinances to keep in mind:

- No parking is allowed in your front yard. It is against Ordinance #152.144. This Ordinance is enforceable with a Misdemeanor.
- All dogs must be on a 6-foot leash and waste should be disposed of properly.
- The owner or owners of all lots and premises within the village are required to maintain, repair, and keep safe sidewalks adjacent to or upon his or her lots and premises in or along the public street and alley rights-of-way in the village.
- Use of golf carts or go carts within the Village limits is prohibited.
- Grass and leaves can not be put into the streets.

Do you need a permit?



In the Village of Parma, permits are required for a variety of things including (but not limited to) **pools, mechan**-

ical work (electrical, plumbing), fences, decks, roofs, new sheds/outbuildings, construction, driveway changes, etc. Permits are available at the village office. If the proper permits are not obtained there could be additional fees.

The Village offers residents the option to receive their utility bill via


email. Let the Village office know if you would prefer this option. You will no longer receive a paper copy of your bill if you choose this option.

WIPES CLOG PIPES!





Easy Science Experiment

Supplies Needed:

- "Flushable" Wipe
- Toilet Paper
- 2 Canning Jars with Lids
- Marker (for labeling)

Instructions:

LUSHA

Place wipe in one jar, and toilet paper in the other. Label each jar with contents and date if desired. Fill each jar with water and tighten lid. Shake to mix. Observe how each breaks down over time.

increased utility


rates!

Note: some wipes contain non-biodegradable plastics that can take decades to break down.

Did you know?

- Human waste and toilet paper are the <u>ONLY</u> items that should be flushed down the toilet.
- Wipes, even those labeled Flushable, should be disposed of in the trash because they don't break down quickly like toilet paper.
- Because they don't break down easily, wipes can clog pipes in your household plumbing or in the Village's sewer system.
- If a clog occurs in the Village's sewer system, the repair costs may be passed along to the users through higher utility rates.

The Village of Parma Office has leaf bags for \$4 per 10 bags. When the bags are full (no heavier than 20lbs), place them on your curb and they will be picked up. *Please do not place bags out in the rain*. **Remember that grass**

clippings CANNOT be placed in these bags and will not be picked up by the Village.

Recreational Fires

A permit is required for any recreational burning in the Village. Permits can be obtained at the Fire Department at no



cost. Village Ordinance and the NREPA Public Act 451 to burn leaves/pine needles/yard waste/storm damage, garbage in the Village or within <u>1400 ft</u>. of the Village limits.
